In recent years, members and friends of our Great Lakes Bay Region Lutheran schools have joined together in various workshops known as "LEAP-Shops," where they have sought to "Advance Christ-Centered Education through Collaboration." Half of the twelve or so LEAP-Shop past events have specifically brought together education board members, school leaders and/or other representatives of Lutheran schools to share, grow, and plan together. A next such LEAP-Shop "Training/ Enrichment Event for Members and Leaders of Lutheran School Education Boards (or Equivalent Governing Entities)" had twice been scheduled and postponed in 2019. That LEAP-Shop is now once again slated to occur at Valley Lutheran High School in Saginaw on the evening of October 26 (with a light supper and optional tours of the beautiful new, expanded VLHS facilities included). Descriptive information will be disseminated by mid-August, particularly to education board members and other leaders of our Great Lakes Bay Region Lutheran schools, inviting them to meet together at the LEAP-Shop around such topics as selecting board members, evaluating school administrators, developing effective board policies, caring for and supporting school administrators and staff, and maintaining and growing our Lutheran schools.
